Worth the Risk

In the last three years everything we have known about gathering has turned upside down. We went from a society that always met in person to a society familiar with terms like "lock-down," "hybrid church," and "social distancing." The way that we understand being community, building relationships, and being the church has changed.

So what now?

Now it is time to come together and to ask ourselves- what have the last three years taught us about being the church? How can we recommit ourselves to the sacredness found in coming together? How can speak with conviction, take risks, and get creative?

There is deep wisdom in scripture, stories and in personal experience that we can draw from, so come. Say yes. Risk and dream together. We have work to do.

Saturday Morning Keynote: Invitation

We know that gatherings are a large part of our church DNA. We know that we need each other! And yet, community is surprisingly hard to build! What wisdom is there for us in this sacred invitation?

Saturday Evening Keynote: Conviction

This is easier said than done, but maybe there's something that we can learn, as a church, from the "not chill hosts." DIRECTIONS TO EPWORTH BY THE SEA

Epworth by the Sea is located at 100 Arthur J. Moore Drive, St. Simons Island, GA 31522.

From US-17 in Brunswick, take the F.J. Torras Causeway to St. Simons Island. Once you reach St. Simons Island, follow the new round-about left towards Sea Island Road. Go straight through the light. Take first left at Hamilton Road, then right on Arthur J. Moore Drive. Go through the Entrance Gate, and the Front Desk/ Pitts Building will be on your left. Registration will occur near the front desk until 6:30 p.m. Late registration will be available in Brown Auditorium.

CONFERENCE FEES

The in-person Conference Room Rates listed include the cost of the conference, room charges, and three meals, beginning with dinner Friday night. The Commuter Fee includes dinner Friday night, breakfast and lunch on Saturday, and the conference. Kids Camp fee covers meals and activities at Epworth.

In order to receive the Early Bird discount, registrations with FULL payment must be postmarked by January 1. There are no exceptions. After January 1 all registrations must include full payment of the regular fee. After January 26th registration may be limited to commuters and housing cannot be guaranteed.

REGISTRATION PROCESS

Step 1

Each participant must clearly and completely fill out the registration form. There is an online registration form and a printable registration form that can be mailed in. Extra registration forms may be copied or can be downloaded from the presbytery website: www.savannahpresbytery.org.

Step 2

Each participant must turn in their completed registration form online and submit payment online or mail in their registration form and submit payment to his or her church or send directly to presbytery by the deadline to receive that rate.

Step 3

If the church is managing registration, please review all forms, and send in one package, along with a single check from the church covering payment IN FULL for all participants by the registration deadline.

Please Note: There are no exceptions to the registration deadlines. Registrations with full payment must be postmarked on or before the deadlines to receive the fees listed on the next page.

CANCELLATION POLICY

Savannah Presbytery is required to finalize the number of rooms needed with Epworth by January 26th. Any cancellation that arrives after that date is charged to the Presbytery at the full room rate. To be good stewards of the Presbytery's money, the Ministry Team requests that the churches reimburse the Presbytery for any unused rooms reserved at Epworth for the Faith Enrichment Conference.

1. Disaster Recovery in Puerto Rico through PDA

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) has been actively collaborating with local congregations, mid councils, and partner organizations in Puerto Rico since 2017. During this conversation, participants will hear a broader update about the recovery process and what are some key issues affecting the local communities.
