For all her hundred years she had never sat at table and shared social standing with a black person. Then when asked what she missed the most, she started naming the African Americans who had lived and worked around her on her farm. They had been special to her. She had even kept up with them long after they had migrated to the North

When I shared with her, that when she arrived at the great feast Jesus spoke about in the parable, she would be seated right in the midst of them, and they would laugh together about how misguided all that segregation stuff had been.

She rejected the thought at first, but a couple of months later she wrote me that the black woman, who had lived on the farm for many years and prepared her breakfast, was eating breakfast with her. The great feast had begun!

Race remains a divide in our land, and one of the best ways to learn more about each other across that divide is to share table fellowship.
