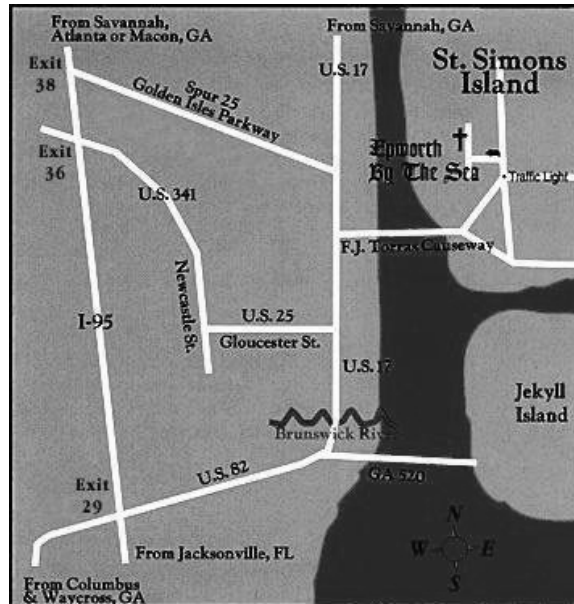

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## Directions to Epworth By The Sea, St. Simons Island, Georgia



### **From Statesboro/Dublin areas:**

Take I-16 E towards Savannah. Take Exit 157A to I-95 S. Take I-95 S to exit 38 (Golden Isles Pkwy/Spur 25). Take a left onto Spur-25. Follow the Spur until it merges right onto US-17 S. Take a left onto the F.J. Torras Causeway (there will be three left hand turn lanes and a Peaches gas station on the left corner). The causeway will take you to St. Simons Island (follow directions below).

### **From Jesup/Eastman/Vidalia areas:**

Take US-341 South to Brunswick. Follow 341 all the way into downtown Brunswick (341 turns into Newcastle Street). Take a left at the intersection of Newcastle and Gloucester Streets. Follow Gloucester to the end; take a left at the light onto US-17 N. Immediately get into the right hand lane, and this will merge right, onto the F.J. Torras Causeway. The causeway will take you to St. Simons Island (follow directions below).

### **From Waycross/St. Marys areas:**

From Waycross, take US-82 S towards Brunswick. US-82 will turn into US-17. From St. Marys, take I-95 N to exit 29 (US-17/South Georgia Parkway) and take a right onto US-17 N. For both, follow US-17 N over the Sidney Lanier Bridge into Brunswick. Pass through the intersection at Gloucester Street and merge right onto the F.J. Torras Causeway (across from the Winn Dixie shopping plaza). The causeway will take you to St. Simons Island (follow directions below).

### **For Everyone:**

Once on St. Simons, at the end of the causeway stay in the left lane and continue following the roundabout to Sea Island Road. Go straight through the traffic light, staying on Sea Island Road. Turn left at the first street marked Hamilton Road and then right onto Arthur J. Moore Drive. We will be in the Brown Center Auditorium, next to the soccer field. If you get lost or need help with directions, please call the Front Desk at Epworth, 912-638-8688.

## **Call to Order & Prayer**

**Moderator, Paul Scott**

## **Report of the Stated Clerk**

**Russell Gladding, CRE**

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### **Recommendation:**

1. The Stated Clerk recommends that Savannah Presbytery use the following procedure for voting on the proposed amendments to the Book of Order and the Book of Confessions. That no more than one hour be allotted for the report of the Permanent Judicial Commission (PJC) and the discussion and voting on the amendments. This hour shall be divided allotting five minutes for PJC report, twenty-five minutes for amendments to the Book of Order, and thirty minutes for the amendment to the Book of Confessions. That discussion rotate back and forth between pro and con, and no one person speak on any amendment more than once. Unless

- otherwise requested we will vote by a show of hands. A simple majority of the votes cast will determine whether the presbytery is for or against any amendment. **Approved.**
2. That the privilege of voice on the floor be extended to Debra Hepler and the Staff of Savannah Presbytery. **Approved.**
  3. That the Administrative Commission to Blackshear Presbyterian Church be dissolved per their request in the attached final report. **Approved with gratitude.**

Blackshear Presbyterian Church  
Administrative Commission Final Report

At the last meeting of the administrative commission for Blackshear Presbyterian Church we voted in favor of asking the Savannah Presbytery to dissolve the administrative commission. The commission feels that it has fulfilled its directive from the Presbytery to make sure that the congregation Blackshear Presbyterian was given the chance to elect a panel of elders who reflected the whole church and that the session demonstrated a willingness to handle church business in a way that conforms to Presbyterian polity. The commission feels that both of these things have been accomplished. With this said the commission feels strongly that the church continues to need a strong partnership with presbytery as they move forward facing challenges that most small churches now face in terms of financial sustainability and growth of membership. Our hope is that the church's ongoing relationship with the committee on ministry will provide this support and enable the church to continue to strengthen and prosper as a community of faith. We continue to pray for Blackshear Presbyterian Church and wish them the best as they move forward as an instrument of God's kingdom in the world.

### **Information Only**

1. In order to amend the Book of Order a majority of the 178 presbyteries must vote in the affirmative for the proposal. A two thirds vote of the presbyteries is required to continue the process of amending the Book of Confessions. If this approval is voted by the presbyteries, the 221<sup>st</sup> General Assembly must pass it in order for the change to the confession be made.



3. Annual Statistics are in process. Savannah Presbytery has completed 41% of its member churches as of January 30, 2013. That's 17 of 41 congregations. There is a deadline of February 20, 2013. Please help us with this important task.
4. Per Capita is something we will bring up in our discussions today. The presbytery is mandated by the constitution to pay this amount to the Synod and General Assembly as a part of our heritage as a connectional church. We currently pay over \$50,000 annually for this part of our mission. That breaks down currently to \$6.87 per member to the OGA and \$2.45 for Synod. We pay that for approximately 6000 members on the rolls of our churches. We gladly pay for the work of the larger church, a good portion of which comes back to Savannah Presbytery in grants and other items like full pay for our Commissioners and Young Adult Advisory Delegates to the General Assembly. However, by keeping accurate rolls of members there may be a saving of expense in our budget. Please think about this as you look at your rolls during 2013.
5. The Reverend Greg Gillispie will be working with the Stated Clerk in proposing changes to the Provisional Manual of Savannah Presbytery and merging it with pertinent information from the 2003 Manual of Savannah Presbytery. These proposals will be brought to the presbytery through the approval process of the Savannah Presbytery Council. The goal is to have a new and complete manual to vote on at our October Stated Meeting.
6. Pastors and Commissioners are reminded that Sessions must submit Changes in Terms of Call and copies of church insurance policies to the presbytery annually. This should be done prior to the May stated Meeting. The Changes in Terms of Call will not be published per the Book of Order (G-2.0804.)

## **Report of the General Presbyter Ruling Elder Russell Gladding**

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I have suggested to the Presbytery Council and they have agreed that the theme of Savannah Presbytery for 2013 be, "A Time for Connecting and Reconnecting." As we work with each other in southeast Georgia, we are busy building, rebuilding, and in some cases still attempting to build relationships with each other. In doing so we are working at being a connectional presbytery, a covenant people within these geographical bounds. What that entails is seeking to fulfill God's mission for The Church in this place and time; and to do it despite anything that would divide us culturally, personally, or politically.

God has called the Church into being under the name of Jesus Christ, our Lord and our Savior. Jesus said follow me; don't stop to argue who is right or wrong about a certain issue, who is first or last; follow me. If we look at who those first twelve were, we could not find a more diverse bunch. Most Rabbis chose the elite, the cream of the crop, the very best theology students, the upper class as their disciples. But Jesus chose fishermen, tax collectors, political zealots; he chose the uneducated, the poor, and the most diverse group imaginable to build His Kingdom.

If Matthew and Peter could work together, what is it that limits us? Of course there were times when they argued like we do. They fell short of what they wished to be and Jesus, I imagine was frustrated and saddened, but they knew where their calling was, where their center was, and they followed. The Church was born.

So here we are, Savannah Presbytery, 41 churches, we have differences within our denomination and if we are honest we make judgments about our fellow PCUSA brothers and sisters and even to the larger Christian community. Some have decided that, "like mindedness," is what we should be about. This is not new. It has been happening since the reformation and before, but it is, in my opinion, not what we are to be about. Jesus and His church calls all God's children, with all of the diversity and differences

we have to “follow Me!” He calls us to a connectional church, to a Great Banquet where we may find abundant life together.

As we seek to be connected, to reconnect, to find our center in God’s mission here, we are not alone and cannot accomplish this alone. God’s Holy Spirit is blowing across this presbytery as I see the acts of mercy and kindness through countless ministries in our congregations. My friends, God is our refuge and strength, God is our greatest resource when we feel there is not enough. God is able to do more than we can ever imagine. As we seek to connect and reconnect, let us knock and seek and find the Holy Spirit’s power within each of us. May we find the great power of prayer as we seek God’s face.

I have begun an intentional prayer group via Skype each Monday morning at 8:30AM. Any who wish, may call in if you are on Skype. Better yet, I challenge you to find several friends who would join you in your own group, in person or other ways. However you do it, take the time to ask for God’s presence, and for God’s Spirit to guide us in our journey of following The One Who Leads The Church, as we seek to connect or reconnect in service to God’s Church!

## **Report of Treasurer**

### **Ruling Elder Russell Gladding**

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2012 Financial Reports are presented with this report. The good news is that we were able to meet all of our budgeted items, including our per capita giving to the General Assembly of the PCUSA. The only exceptions were that we did not pay our per capita or mission giving to the Synod of South Atlantic or the \$10,000 item to the Swainsboro Hispanic Ministry. The Presbytery Council has advised the Treasurer to pay the Synod per capita and mission giving items. We paid \$30,000 to the Swainsboro Hispanic Ministry and their congregation was able to take care of the remaining items in their ministry from their offering income.

The not so good news is that our 2012 budget was again balanced with an agreed upon \$40,000 use if the New Covenant Growth Fund, thus depleting a presbytery asset. In the opinion of the Treasurer this is not a wise course of action in our future and would not sustain us over the long haul.

As General Presbyter I have asked the Council, and they have agreed that our theme this year in Savannah Presbytery is to focus on our connectional church. A major part of being Presbyterian is to have a connection in our Stewardship of resources. That includes our treasure. The presbytery in 2012 spent time discerning where God is leading us. The 2013 budget will be presented and discussed today. This budget was put together with the items we said we wanted, but the unified pledges that have come in and that we have in some cases assumed will come in (based on 2012 actual giving) fall short of what is needed. So we need to talk.

Attached to this report is the 2013 budget and two charts which may be helpful in our conversations. The first is pledge income given by our churches for years 2006 through 2012 compared to the size of the presbytery’s expenses from the same period. The second chart shows the 2013 pledges of our churches by gift per member (using the membership rolls the churches have given to the presbytery.)

The outgoing Chair of the Presbytery Council will present the budget and members of the council will facilitate our breakout group discussions. It is my feeling, and that of the council, that this is not our problem to deal with alone; and so we bring it to you with prayer and hope through faith that God will be present with us and through our connectedness as we seek to be where God is calling Savannah Presbytery to be.

## Breakout Discussion Groups & Plenary Session

The commissioners broke into 5 small groups to brainstorm suggestions for addressing the budget shortfall.

The following suggestions were proffered once the groups reconvened for the Plenary Session.

1. Reflect on and ask God for guidance for solutions. What is God calling the church to do?
2. Make sure that churches understand what a budget deficit could mean to their access to Presbytery assistance, programs, and missions.
3. Educate churches on costs associated with being a “connectional” denomination, i.e, per capita and mission; and Presbytery specific programs and administration, i.e., Pastoral and leadership programs and camps.
4. Evaluate specific costs associated with Presbytery programs and make them self-sufficient going forward.



5. Individual churches may have to totally fund youth and mission trips.
6. Develop and implement Presbytery Development, Stewardship, and fundraising program to highlight ways churches and individuals can donate directly to the Presbytery and/or specific Presbytery programs.
7. Targeted fundraising to support new missions, i.e., Hispanic mission.
8. Revoke Presbytery privileges, i.e, voting, etc. from churches who do not contribute to revenue stream.
9. Suggested tithe should include Per Capita amount for each member.
10. Summit of church clerks and treasurers to evaluate situation short term and long term.
11. Cut mileage reimbursements for meetings, or ask in kind donations from lay members.
12. Review Presbytery staffing, review building and equipment use (sell or rent), reorganize or dissolve Presbytery to reflect new “reality”.
13. Continue business as usual with better stewardship and asset management. Pray for discernment and direction.

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## Committee Reports with Recommendations

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### Report of the Presbytery Council Rev. Andy Meeker, Moderator

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#### **Recommendations:**

1. The Council recommends to the Presbytery the following procedure for dealing with the adoption of the 2013 budget. **Approved**
  - A. The Council submits the deficit budget to the Presbytery.
  - B. That breakout sessions, concerning the budget, facilitated by Council members be used at the February Stated Meeting to discern where God is calling Savannah Presbytery to be, in its stewardship, during 2013.
  - C. A plenary session will follow the breakouts to compile the ideas and suggestions. These will be presented to the Finance and Stewardship Committee, Sessions, and Ministry Teams. Sessions and Ministry Teams should submit written reports of their suggestions to the Treasurer who will forward them to the Finance and Stewardship Committee. F& S will present the findings and recommendations to the Presbytery Council.
  - D. Adoption of the 2013 budget will be tabled until the May Stated Meeting. The presbytery will continue to operate on the proposed 2013 budget, as it is able, until this meeting.
2. The council recommends to the Presbytery that anyone wishing to bring a verbal report or motion to the floor of a Stated Meeting must submit that report in writing to the Stated Clerk. This may be done in one of two ways. **Approved.**

- A. In order to be included in the Stated Meeting Handbook, the report must be submitted four weeks and prior to the Presbytery Council meeting where the docket is approved for the Stated Meeting.
- B. If A is not done, a written report with 100 copies may be presented to the Stated Clerk up until 9:30 AM the day of the Stated Meeting. The Presbytery may then consider whether or not to amend the docket to include such a report.

**Information:**

1. Robert Hay, Jr., our Presbyterian Foundation Ministry Relations Officer, presented an update on the foundation and its management of the various investment funds under its care. The New Covenant Growth Fund is Savannah Presbytery's major asset dedicated to Church Transformation. The foundation also manages the trust fund of our MK Pentecost and Jean Alexander Funds.

## **Team Reports**

### **Report of Committee on Ministry Rev. Eric Beene, Chair**

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**Information Only**

1. The Committee dissolved the pastoral relationship between the Rev. Greg Gillispie and Richmond Hill Presbyterian Church and approved their agreement for dissolution and separation.
2. The Committee dismissed the Rev. John Wall to Trinity Presbytery upon request.
3. The Committee approved the temporary supply covenant between the Rev. Kathi Parchem and First Presbyterian Church of Hinesville.
4. The temporary supply covenants between the Rev. Gradye Allison and Jekyll Island Presbyterian Church and between the Rev. Ainars Berzinch and Blackshear Presbyterian Church both expired in January. The Committee is working with those two congregations to secure temporary supply and assess their long-term needs for pastoral leadership.
5. The Committee dissolved the pastoral relationship between the Rev. Troy Hauser-Brydon and St. Simon's Presbyterian Church upon request of the congregation and pastor. The Committee also authorized the Stated Clerk to take the necessary steps to transfer Rev. Hauser-Brydon's membership to his new presbytery upon receipt of a request.
6. The members of the Committee feel that our new practice of annual visits with each congregation in the Presbytery have been very successful. We have built relationships and learned what is going on in our congregations, and we have heard that Session members and others in congregations feel more connected with the work of the whole Presbytery when we visit. We also believe that congregations will more easily reach out to the rest of the Presbytery because they have met a member of our committee who has taken the time to listen to the joys and the struggles of ministry in their particular contexts. The members of the Committee once again have accepted responsibility to serve as companions to the congregations of our Presbytery, and we intend to visit with each Session again in the coming year. Moderators or Clerks of Sessions should be hearing in the coming months from a member of the Committee to set up a time for a visit. We are grateful for the chance to sit down and learn more about how God is working among our congregations!

#### The 2012 District III Presbytery Youth in Mission July 8-13 2012

Twenty three youth and adults from across our presbytery, representing 5 churches, spent a week together last July on a traveling mission trip within the bounds of District III. Their “hands-on” mission work included a 5 mile beach clean up on

Cumberland Island, working at the Bethesda House of Mercy, the Humane Society in Waycross, clearing a lot in downtown Brunswick, and stocking shelves for Second Harvest Food Bank. Special thanks to the Saint Simons Presbyterian Church, First Church Waycross, First Church Brunswick, and First Church Saint Marys for hosting the group. *The photo above was taken at First Church Brunswick who prepared a scrumptious supper, lodged us in their own homes for the night, and fed us breakfast the next morning!*

The goal of this model of youth in mission is to rotate the trip each year through the presbytery districts. This summer (2013) we plan to host the youth mission experience within District II.



#### First Presbyterian, Statesboro Haiti June 2012

In June of 2012 a ten-member team from the First Presbyterian Church of Statesboro travelled to Port-au-Prince, Haiti to worship and work alongside our friends at Haiti Outreach Ministries. H.O.M. is a

well established Christian mission to the people of Haiti, which operates in four distinct communities in and around the capital city, and focuses on evangelism, education, health care, and job training. While staying at the ministry's guest house in the Blanchard community (also called Terre Noire), the FPC team assisted Haitian work crews on a variety of construction and renovation projects, including new homes, storage facilities, and classroom furniture. Each night after a long day of work we sat down together -- filthy, tired, and happy -- to enjoy an authentic Haitian meal atop the roof of the Blanchard compound.

All in all, the most memorable part of the trip was the relationships formed with our Haitian brothers and sisters. We were welcomed into their worship and treated as honored guests; we were welcomed into their communities and homes, where the children gathered to see and touch the *blans* -- that is, foreigners or white folks. Through our silly games and halting attempts at bilingual conversation, we were graced to discover our common humanity, our mutual interdependence in the global family of God.

FPC plans to continue its relationship with H.O.M. for years to come. In fact, the founding pastor of the organization, the Rev. Leon Dorleans, just visited Statesboro this past fall and preached to a packed sanctuary! We request the prayers and support of the Savannah Presbytery as we all move forward in mission together. As the Haitians say, *Bon Dye ap travay*: God is working!



### **Frederica Presbyterian Church Honduras – October 2012**

Oct. 20-27, 2012, a group of 6 missionaries headed out from St. Simons Island to Tegucigalpa, Honduras to serve the children of El Hogar (The Home of Love and Hope). The children of El Hogar have come from situations of much despair---many came from the streets. Many come from such extreme poverty their parents just couldn't keep them. El Hogar provides not only a safe environment for the kids to grow up in, but also the education needed to break the cycle of poverty. Most importantly, these children hear everyday about a God who loves them

unconditionally. The experience of El Hogar is really hard to put in words. Seeing the Gospel work in the lives of these children is truly amazing.

Our work for the week mostly included painting, but this is really secondary to the time we spent with the children. ### **First Presbyterian Church Savannah Summer 2013**

This summer a group of nine youth and two advisors from First Savannah spent a week in the village of Aldea El Xab, near Retalhuleu, Guatemala, which is located in the Southwest region of the country. The group was hosted by the Iglesia Presbiteriana Sol de Justicia (Sun of Righteousness Presbyterian Church). The

group partnered with Presbyterian Mission co-worker Philip Beisswenger who is part of the PRESGOV (<http://presgov.org/>) organization which partners churches in Guatemala with congregations in the United States. The group stayed at a local Presbyterian seminary and worked with the congregation to help build a floor and roof for a new Sunday school room that will serve their young children. The group was met with great hospitality and was fed incredible meals prepared each day over an open fire by the great chefs of the Church. The youth spent time building, developing relationships with the church's youth, making tortillas, playing soccer, exploring Mayan ruins and visiting beautiful Lake Atitlan. On the final day with the Church, they held a very moving send-off worship service and the group realized how, in less than a week and despite the language barrier, they had all developed bonds of Christian friendship.

This report is merely a glimpse of the many ways in which God is working in and among the communities of faith within the Savannah Presbytery through "hands-on" mission both locally and abroad. All of our churches are encouraged to support the Mission Ministry Team by notification of any opportunities that your congregation may have for others to join you and your mission volunteers in Christian service to others. It is essentially important through our connectional nature to provide these opportunities for members of our smaller congregations.
